



Meeting:

Sue Dumas called the meeting to order and welcomed those in attendance.

Everyone wanted to speak about our Cops & Rodders Fall Pow Wow. Sue said it was a wonderful show in a beautiful setting; Pontiac row was doubled from last year and registration went smoothly. Sergio DaSilva added that there were 143 vehicles preregistered with a final total of 183 registered for the show. Sue thanked everyone for donating raffle prizes.

The pre-show Saturday cruise was considered a success with everyone having a good time. Jay Bittle of JBA was given many kudos for staying late after closing Saturday evening to replace the fuel pump on a 1976 Trans Am driven by an Arizona participant. The car had overheated during the cruise.

Guests to our meeting were Sherry and George Lee who own a 1964 GTO. They were the recipients of the Favorite Classic Muscle 64-72 award.

Sue informed everyone that this is the time to consider running for 2025 officer positions. Nominations will be taken and voted upon with the winners announced in December. Roland Short announced that the Activities Chair position is open.

Sue presented Jim Thomson with the Certificate of Recognition and Appreciation 2024 Pontiac Oakland Club International Chapter Editor Award, San Diego Chapter #58. This was well-deserved recognition for the excellent work Jim commits to this endeavor and he was applauded by the members.

Treasurer's Report:

Sue reported that 183 vehicles were registered for our car show. The raffle brought in \$754; the 50/50 drawing totaled \$432 with half (\$216) going to our club. Coffee and donuts received \$39 which virtually paid for themselves. Vendors paid \$300. Donations equaled \$2,075. Bittle donated \$500 towards the parking spaces and signage.

The three charities that will receive donations from the net proceeds of this event are: the San Diego Police Museum; the San Diego Fisher House, and Fleet Week. The amount to be donated will be determined at the November meeting.

Discussion ensued about the division of proceeds with the Cops & Rodders club. This will be voted upon in November.

September 21 - SDPOCI cruise with the Arizona Club. Roland reported that a total of 12 Pontiacs participated in the cruise: 5 from Arizona, 7 SDPOCI club members.

September 14 – Greatest Show on Turf Classic Car Show by San Diego Association of Car Clubs (SDACC). Bill Baugh said it was a great success. Approximately 175 were registered. The Subaru club brought 20 cars and won the trophy for club participation. The show earned enough money to pay for the insurance it provides to members for their individual car shows.



RECREATING THE LOST 'BLUE CAR'

CHAPTER 11



We are pleased to bring Chapter 11 of a series on Greg Raymond's restoration project to build a Tribute to the Royal Bobcat Blue Car from the March 1964 Car and Driver road test. JBA Speed Shop completed the 389ci power plant that out powered what was available back in 1964. The 1966ci Tripower with a forged rotating assembly and Edelbrock heads exceeded 450FtTq and 410hp still climbing at 5200 RPM. The heart of the "Blue Car" is now ready for transplant. Enjoy!

389 COMES TOGETHER! "BLUE CAR"-CHAPTER 11

"A Tribute to Jim Wangers' 1964 GTO 'Test Car' built for Car and Driver's March 1964 Road Test"

Well the numbers are in! As we all have seen, a total of three engine builds were done to finally get to the proper end result. The list of hurdles were note worthy. Heads saw tow rebuilds before the Edelbrock heads were adopted, intake issues with over ported intake runners, exhaust valves over sized, and a center Carb that was not right!

That was the bad news. The good news is the machine shop at JBA Speed Shop figured it all out. After our final build and engine Dyno we hit our number.

451 TQ with 410 hp and still PULLING before we let the rev limiter win the battle at 5100 rpm. A 450tq/450hp TriPower is what was needed for the Blue Car. DONE DEAL!



VISIT TO FRANK'S PONTIAC PARTS IN 29 PALMS



I took a ride up to Frank's Pontiac Parts in Twentynine Palms last week. When I bought my 1968 Firebird in 1989, I made <u>many</u> trips up to Frank's business when he was based out of Ramona. This was before eBay and the widespread use of the internet we have available today to find original (non-China made) Pontiac parts. I don't know how I would have restored my car to stock condition without having Frank's business so close to home.

Frank has been operating out of Twentynine Palms for 17+ years and this was my first trip up to his Pontiac haven in the Mojave Desert. I was amazed how large his operation is. His business encompasses about 7 acres, 4 acres of which is a fenced in yard with close to 200 Pontiacs, workshops and storage buildings chock full of Pontiac parts, all categorized, inventoried, cleaned and ready to see new life! It is a trek, it took me about 3 hours, 15 minutes to get up to the yard, but it wasn't a bad drive if you have the time. It is near Joshua Tree and Yucca Valley.

Frank has a comprehensive website with pictures and descriptions of many of his parts, but in many cases he has more than one of what you need, so looking at the parts and selecting the one you want has a lot of value to me. Plus the parts I was looking for were large, heavy and bulky and I really didn't want to pay for packing and shipping! If you have the time and need original parts for your car, I recommend a visit to Twentynine Palms! You do need to call in advance if you're going to make the trek to ensure Frank will be available when you arrive.







Keeping The Pontiac Legacy Alive...

Formed in 1972 by a small group of enthusiasts who wanted to pool as much Pontiac and Oakland information as was possible, the first convention was held the following year in Camp Hill, Pennsylvania. Since then, POCI chapters have formed all over the country and POCI Conventions have been held every year in a variety of locations. The events include a car show, tech seminars, presentations, drag racing and a great swap meet. GMC trucks were included in 1998, due to their close relation to Pontiac.

The club's magazine, *Smoke Signals*, also started in 1972 and has evolved into a world-class, award-winning monthly that continues to raise the bar for non-commercial publications. *Smoke Signals* was redesigned in 2006 and again in 2013. Today, it is a 92 to100-page, full-color publication printed on heavyweight paper and also comes in digital form.




