President's Notes – San Diego Chapter #58 Pontiac Oakland Club International

Hello everyone. I hope you're all enjoying this Memorial Day holiday weekend. Today is Monday, Memorial Day, originally called Decoration Day. I was curious how this holiday started and what it has meant through the years for us Americans. I was surprised to learn it originally was widely observed on May 30, 1868 to commemorate the sacrifices of Civil Way soldiers. At the first national commemoration, James Garfield made a speech at the Arlington National Cemetery, after more than 20,000 graves of Union and Confederate soldiers were decorated with flags. Today the President will lay a wreath at the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier.

James Garfield speech: "We do not know one promise these men made, one pledge they gave, one word they spoke; but we do know they summed up and perfected, by one supreme act, the highest virtues of men and citizens. For love of country, they accepted death, and thus resolved all doubts, and made immortal their patriotism and their virtue".

I want to thank all of our veterans for their patriotism and the brave sacrifice's that they made protecting American soil and abroad. We have been in Tennessee in the month of May, and they still hold the tradition of decorating all the graves with flowers or flags in all the local cemeteries. It sure was something to see 'Decoration Day' still being observed by the communities there. My father's family is from Tennessee and he and my mother are buried in the family cemetery in Monterey. Before they passed, we had gone with them and my Aunt Jane to several cemeteries to see the graves of my great- great relatives that went back six generations. (continued next page)



JOHN & BARB PLUTH'S 1969 GRAND PRIX SJ

I was raised in a Pontiac family. I might as well say I was born in a Pontiac town. Everyone drove a Pontiac. My dad had owned a 1951, 1955, and 1957 Star Chief. My first car was a 1965 GTO followed by a 1966 Bonneville.

When the 1969 Grand Prix was introduced in 1968 – I HAD TO HAVE ONE. I drove down to John Hine Pontiac in September 1968, sat down with John Hine Sr. in his office and ordered it. Of all the options available, I got the SJ (Sports J) option with power everything and air conditioning. The Grand Prix arrived in six weeks on Thanksgiving Day 1968 and the rest is history.

P.S. Oh, yeah, it wasn't cheap. \$5,800 in 1968 was a lot of money, plus tax and license. The 428 c.i. engine was rebuilt by Holman Motors in Hibbing, MN, about 30 years ago included some upgrades (long-branch manifolds and 3" exhaust), new valves, pistons and cam and have less than 5,000 miles on them.

JOHN & BARB PLUTH'S 1969 GRAND PRIX SJ

On page 205 of Pontiac ad man Jim Wangers memoir, Glory Days, there's a black and white photo of John Z. DeLorean at perhaps the height of his powers. It's fall 1968, and Pontiac's general manager is standing between two factory-fresh examples of his latest creation, the 1969 Pontiac Grand Prix.

The caption reads, "The 1969 Grand Prix was truly DeLorean's car, with a little help from marketing researcher Ben Harrison, who suggested converting the full-size Grand Prix to the smaller Abody sedan chassis. It was an immediate success and became the image leader for all personal luxury coupes. In an era of excess, the 1969 Grand Prix could brag about having the longest hood in the industry."

Design innovations included concealed wipers, Alfa Romeostyle flush door handles, and a radio antenna embedded in the windshield for a cleaner look. It was an industry first. The interior was luxurious with its bucket seats and featured a radical wraparound cockpit-style dashboard.

"That was John DeLorean's concept," Wangers once told auto writer Joe Oldham. "It was his idea to capture the spirit and essence of the old Duesenbergs of the 1930s. Great cars, very high-performance road machines with all the trappings of the luxury marques of the day, like Cadillac and Packard. He even insisted Pontiac use the old Duesenberg model designations, J and SJ."

Powering the Grand Prix J was Pontiac's 350-hp 400-cubic-inch V-8 with 10:1 compression. For the first year only, a 265-hp 400 with 8.6:1 compression and a two-barrel carburetor was also available. The Grand Prix SJ got Pontiac's 370-hp 428 or the optional 390-hp 428 H.O. Both models were available with a Muncie four-speed or a Turbo 400 automatic. Sales exploded to over 112,000 that first year, but only 676 were ordered with the manual.


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RECREATING THE LOST 'BLUE CAR'

"A Tribute to Jim Wangers' 1964 GTO 'Test Car' built for Car and Driver's March 1964 Road Test"

With the team at San Diego's JBA Speed Shop building the "Blue Car's" power plant into record setting form, lets take some time to see what the team at "Patterson's Speed & Kustom" in San Diego, CA are doing getting the body ready for it's Nocturne Blue Paint.



We were able to pull the drive train and the interior out in short order and with a call to AAA we delivered the car to the Body Shop. The Patterson crew are long time friends and were fellow co-workers at JBA Speed Shop. They have built some of the greatest show vehicles in Southern California and have a rich pedigree in American Muscle cars, exotic Imports and custom fabrication.

The car was in excellent shape. No doubt due to the over 22 years it sat covered in Terry Saunders' garage. The Patterson's took the car all the way down to the bare steel and were amazed at the complete lack of rust on this 60 year old Pontiac. The primary area that needed attention was the trunk floor. It appeared that at some point there was a chemical spill that chewed up the trunk floor pans. Nothing that these guys couldn't handle.

We head back to JBA Speed Shop next month to get the final engine dyno numbers for our Tri-Power engine upgrade!






