The cars in the club range from Concourse cars, show cars, daily drivers, drag racers, and cars undergoing restoration.

#### **CALL TO ORDER:**

Dave Whiteman welcomed everyone in attendance. He explained that Sue and J.C. Dumas were out of town celebrating their anniversary and J.C.'s birthday. He noted that we had three visitors and asked them to introduce themselves.

Randy Farley said he mailed in his membership form and was welcomed as a new member. He owns a 1978 Trans Am, a Gold Special Edition, which he bought new when he was in college. It's a Pontiac 400, 4-speed and it has never been smogged. He retired from the Navy where he flew P-3s. Randy said he is looking for someone to help with electrical work.



Rad and Rebecca Alabsi, with two-and-a-half-month-old baby Tarek, joined the meeting and also plan to submit a membership application. They own a 1965 red GTO that was gifted to them two months ago by Rebecca's Uncle Curt. Rebecca's dad has a 1964 GTO in Idaho.

### Minutes:

- Dave Baker made a motion to accept the Minutes of July 13, 2025.
- Jim Taylor seconded the motion.
- The motion passed unanimously.

Dave asked Greg and was told that he had created a new list of names for mail distribution of future events. He said that if anyone didn't want to be included in the mailings, they would need to contact him directly.

Greg also gave an update on the artwork for our Cops & Rodders Fall Pow Wow T-shirts. He said the artwork he had for our T-shirt used at our first car show was very poor, but that he will continue to search for better quality artwork.

### **Treasurer's Report:**

Dave presented the Treasurer's Report which Sue had provided. Deposits were made for 19 registrations, one membership and a \$300 trophy donation. Payments were made for flyers, car show trash boxes, and three spaces at the Pechanga Arena for Labor Day.

In August, there were deposits of \$490 for 14 registrations and a payment for flyers, There iare a total of 44 registered cars for the C&RFPW as of August 2nd.

Dave offered copies of letters to be distributed to prospective sponsors of the car show.

### San Diego Association of Car Clubs:

Bill Baugh reported that the last Meet-Up of SDACC for 2025 was held at Big Kahuna's on August 5. They will resume in April 2026 through August 2026 and be held in the mezzanine of the San Diego Auto Museum. The Meet-Ups are open to everyone.

He said the Greatest Show on Turf was approved to be held on September 20 at the Recreation Center. He explained that this show is the big fundraiser to raise funds for insurance premiums for car clubs under the umbrella of SDACC.

Bill gave an update on Senate Bill (SB 712), known as "Leno's Law", the California bill that proposes to exempt classic cars from the state's smog check requirements. He said the bill is still in Committee. It was passed by the Assembly and has been forwarded to the State Senate. Club members can go to the SEMA Action Network for California for continuing updates on all legislation.



The San Marino Motor Classic is a non-profit event in Southern California that showcases a carefully curated collection of nearly 500 authentic, concours-level classic cars from various eras and 38 distinct classes, from pre-war antiques to post-war sports cars. Held annually in Lacy Park in San Marino, the event features a prestigious display of automotive history and style, with vehicles restored to their original factory condition and judged for their authenticity and style.

The San Marino Motor Classic is the premier regional automotive exhibition in the San Gabriel Valley and one of the premier concours-level exhibitions in Southern California. This particular show follows American Concours d'Elegance Pebble Beach in Northern California, often described as the "Sister Show". As you would expect, the application process was lengthy and required approval by the board. SDPOCI member Jim "Old Man" Taylor and I were lucky enough to get accepted into the show field. This was arguably the most prestigious show I have ever been invited to and when accepted, stepped up to the challenge to display my father's 1964 GTO convertible in the best light ever.

Being a premier concours-level show, it was time to revisit details that I have let linger on my list of "To-Do's". With the help of key partners like JBA Speed Shop, Carlos Robles and Brandon Garcia at Pure Detailing, we combed over dad's first car, ordered by him and my grandfather in December of 1963 upon my dad's graduation from West Point Military Academy. Every loose end was addressed and I have to say, the car never looked better.













Being the true Pontiac enthusiast that I was groomed to be, despite the sheer perfection of the car's show-field ready condition, this Pontiac hit the freeway heading north with all three carburetors wide open! Leaving at 5:30 am the day before, the drive was short and sweet, arriving in San Marino at an early 7:30 am. My planning proved to be the proper move as the horror stories from Jim "Old Man" Taylor would reflect rain, traffic collisions and fires along his commute just hours later.

Fellow longtime friends and respected colleagues were all in attendance. My partner in crime, Dave Anderson, respected and loved POCI legend Carter Chee, the true holder of all that is of value in the representation of the 1964 GTO, Tenney Fairchild, Jim Taylor and one of my most respected friends ever, Gordon Wangers, Jim Wangers nephew were all there and then some!

We all met at Lacy Park and positioned the cars accordingly. The GTO Class had a healthy representation of GTO's and if I can say this, Jim Taylor's car has a paint job that is unlike anything I have ever seen. His carful combination of metal flake in a very respectable version matching his cars original color came alive in the San Marino sun.

Speaking of the San Marino sun... It was HOT! Jim and I sheltered down in the beautiful tree line that surrounds Lacy Park. This gave me the opportunity to be close to my father's GTO and tell "The Story". At an event like this, it's provenance which leads the spectators and











judge's respect. That felt good. It wasn't that my father's GTO never looked so good, it wasn't that any cars in the category were not as good or arguably better. Taking a page from editor Jim Thomsons 30 years of shameless promotion of our Clubs most honored and awarded Firebirds, I chose to stay close and tell the story. That proved to be of winning consequence. Of the three GTO's selected by the judges, both Jim "Old Man" Taylor and I took home a class trophy. As recipients, we were staged in the center of the show filed in line to receive our awards... for every bit of an hour in direct sunlight... with a convertible... yes, top down. The sunburn is still in full facial effect!

However, as I pulled up to the podium, not only did dad's GTO take first in the GTO class... it was awarded the Chief Pontiac Award... this is an award that takes into consideration every Pontiac in attendance at the San Marino Motor Classic. Staggered, emotional and thankful, I accepted this honor with tears in my eyes and thoughts of, my father... who just looked at this GTO as "The Family Car:". Enjoy the photos!

















































### RECREATING THE LOST "BLUE CAR"

### CHAPTER 15



We are pleased to bring the next chapter of a series on Greg Raymond's restoration project to build a Tribute to the Royal Bobcat Blue Car from the March 1964 Car and Driver road test. As the body shop closes in on finishing the paint and body work, Greg is concentrating on the small details that will see this project replicate the Pilot Car that participated in the famed C&D Road Test!



# DETAILS, DETAILS! "BLUE CAR"-CHAPTER 15

"A Tribute to Jim Wangers' 1964 GTO 'Test Car' built for Car and Driver's March 1964 Road Test"

I saw a post from Speed Society on FaceBook... "A car build is never about showing off to others. It's about proving something to yourself." It struck me in a good way. This is not my first build, so I am aware of one personal feeling I have had with every build. I love the process. With this one, the process is particularly enjoyable.



When you embark on a journey to recreate a piece of history, the details matter. The "Blue Car" will never be seen again as it met the fate of the almighty crusher. So putting in the hours to do the research on what this car should really be and represent became a primary focus. This is the area that gives me the most satisfaction.

This month we dive into yet another detail that sort of fell into my lap. The 2024 Hot Rod Power Tour made a visit to my home town of San Diego. There just happened to be a 1964 GTO in attendance. It didn't take long to strike up a conversation with the owner about his particular "early build" GTO. He informed me that a key indicator of an early built 1964 GTO cold be identified in the design of the tail lamp lenses.

As you can see in the image on the opening page of the Car & Driver Article, the "Blue Car" clearly had inset brake lights with the reflector located on the outside corners. The Pilot Car, built slower with the attention of everyone in the plant with both engineering and design center personnel responsible for the new model, would have been the first ever built of the history changing Pontiac GTO. As it turns out, someone at Pontiac in the Design Center made the decision to redesign the lenses later in 1964 for safety purposes. Apparently moving the reflector to the center and pushing one of the brake lights to the far corners improved night-time visibility.





# DETAILS, DETAILS! "BLUE CAR"-CHAPTER 15 "A Tribute to Jim Wangers' 1964 GTO 'Test Car' built for Car and Driver's March 1964 Road Test"



While a bit difficult to see in this image of the GTO that helped me uncover this, the reflector is located on the outside ends of both lenses. Sure enough, with a little digging we were able to find the Pontiac Service Bulletin No. 64-76, issued in May 1964. This bulletin addressed this change in the tail lamp lenses for the 1964 GTO.

That's a detail that we certainly could not miss. A few minutes on eBay and we had an OEM set on the way.

Next month we should be officially out of the paint booth. With any luck this project will pick up some steam and be ready to hit the pavement by the end of the year.
